of which I die possessed shall be inherited by my husband

In the event of my husband not surviving me I desire
that all my property, real & personal, should be divided
equally between my two sons, Ralph Hall Caine, the elder,
& Derwent Hall Caine, the younger, with the condition
that they should make the following small bequests

- 1. To my sister Jennie (Mrs. Mandeville) Pounds
to help her to bring up her large family.
- 2. To my God-daughter Greeba Jackson Pounds
as a small remembrance of me...
- 3. To "little Elin" (registered Elin Stephen)
Pounds towards her education & upbringing...

I also Desire that my husband's Executors, Mr.G.A.Ring
of the Isle of Man & Mr.George Bowler of Liverpool
should kindly act as my Executors also for the fulfilment
of the conditions of this Will...

Will...


